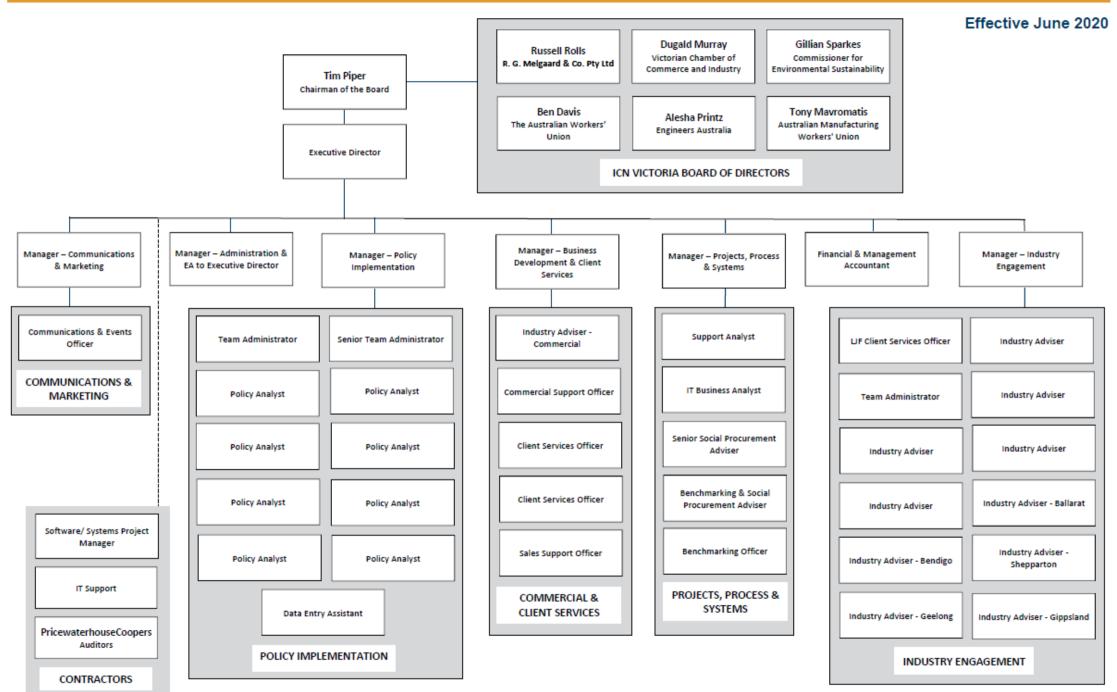

LEGAL COMPLIANCE

• Assure the filing of all legal and regulatory documents and monitors compliance with relevant laws and regulations and any changes as they occur.

MISSION, POLICY AND PLANNING

- Assist the Board to monitor and update ICN's values, mission, vision, and short- and long-term goals.
- Help the Board monitor and evaluate ICN's relevancy to its stakeholders and industry, its effectiveness, and its
 results.
- Keep the Board fully informed on the condition of ICN and on all the important factors influencing it.
- Identify problems and opportunities and address them; brings those which are appropriate to the Board and/or its committees; and, facilitate discussion and deliberation.
- Inform the Board and its committees about trends, issues, problems and activities in order to facilitate policy-making. Recommend policy positions.
- Keep informed of developments in OH&S, human services, not-for-profit management, Governance and funding development.

MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION

- Provide general oversight of all ICN activities, manage the day-to-day operations, and ensure a smoothly functioning, efficient organization.
- Assure program quality and organizational stability through development and implementation of standards and controls, systems and procedures, and regular evaluation.
- Assure a work environment that recruits, retains and supports quality staff.
- Assure processes for selecting, development, motivating, and evaluating staff.
- Recommend staffing and financing to the Board of Directors. In accordance with Board action, recruit personnel, negotiate professional contracts, and sees that appropriate salary structures are developed and maintained.
- Specify accountabilities for management personnel and evaluates performance regularly.

GOVERNANCE

- Help the Board articulate its own role and accountabilities and that of its committees and individual members, and help evaluate performance regularly.
- Work with the Board Chair to enable the Board to fulfil its governance functions and facilitates the optimum performance by the Board, its committees and individual Board members.
- With the Board Chair, focus Board attention on long-range strategic issues.

- Manages the Board's due diligence process to assure timely attention to core issues.
- Work with the Board officers and committee chairs to get the best thinking and involvement of each Board member.
- Recommend staff members to participate in the Board and its committees.

FINANCING

- Promote ICN programs and services that are produced in a cost-effective manner, employing economy while maintaining an acceptable level of quality.
- Oversee the fiscal activities of the organization including budgeting, reporting and audit.
- Work with Board to ensure financing to support short and long-term goals.
- Develop effective State, Federal and other funding development programs.
- Help guide and enable the Board to participate actively in the funding development process.

CLIENT RELATIONS

- Facilitate the integration of ICN into the fabric of ICN stakeholders and industry by using effective marketing and communications activities.
- Act as an advocate within the public and private sectors for issues relevant to ICN, its services and its stakeholders.
- Listen to stakeholders, clients, and industry in order to improve services and industry activity. Assure awareness of ICN's response to industry needs.
- Serve as chief spokesperson for ICN, assuring proper representation of ICN to its stakeholders, industry and the ICN national network.
- Initiate, develop, and maintain cooperative relationships with key stakeholders and clients.
- Work with government agencies to promote legislative and regulatory policies that encourage positive environments for industry
