TRANSLATING SERVICES

How to access an immediate phone interpreter If you are a non-English speaker

- Call Translating and Interpreting Service (TIS) National on 131 450.
- An automated prompt will ask you which language you need. Please state the language that you require.
- When you are connected to a TIS National operator, say the language you need again.
- Stay on the line while the operator finds an available interpreter for you.

The operator will connect you with an interpreter in the language you asked for. You will be asked to provide:

- Your name
- The name of the organisation you need to contact
- The phone number of the organisation you need to contact.

Stay on the line while the operator connects you and the interpreter through to the organisation.



FI FCTRICITY

Rates

- Balonne Shire Council issue rates half yearly being mid-August and mid-February
- Rate are due 30 days from date of issue whereby a 10% discount is granted on general rates and most utility charge
- Interest is calculated at a rate of 9.83% compounding on daily rests on all outstanding amounts in accordance with the Reserve Bank of Australia
- All changes to postal details for the service of rate notices must be provided in writing to Council
- Payment plans are available for all property owners who wish to enter into a payment arrangement for any outstanding amounts

- All agreed payment arrangements that are implemented into Council's systems do not accumulate interest on outstanding amounts
- Rate payments can be made by cheque or cash at the Council office at 112-118 Victoria Street St George Qld, payments can also be made by credit card over the phone. Should you wish to set a direct debit payment this will need to be a BPAY payment set up through NetBank.
- The Balonne Shire Council has retained the services of Recoveries & Reconstruction (Aust) Pty Ltd for the collection of outstanding rates
- Receiving hours for payments and inquiries is Monday Friday 8:45am to 5:00pm (Excluding Public Holidays)

Waste Management

Balonne Shire has a two-bin system, residents have a 240L bin for general waste collected weekly, and a 240L bin for recycling collected fortnightly.

The following items can't be recycled:

- plastic bags (they contaminate recycling and jam machinery)
- polystyrenes such as meat trays and foam packaging
- light globes, mirrors and window glass
- crockery, drinking glasses and Pyrex
- sharps and syringes
- nappies

Examples of items we recycle include:

- aluminium and steel tins/cans
- aerosol cans
- glass bottles and jars
- plastic soft-drink and water bottles
- plastic food containers, tubs and trays
- juice and milk cartons and bottles
- 'Tetra Pak' drink containers.
- newspapers and magazines (staples are fine)
- advertising material (remove plastic wrap)
- phone books
- egg cartons
- envelopes (even those with clear plastic windows)
- cardboard boxes.

Fishing

<u>Yellowbelly (Golden Perch)</u>: Bronze to slate green above, sides golden olive shading to yellow or white below. Best eating fish of the western streams. The flesh is firm, white with good flavour. Average Size: [can reach 23 kg in QLD]. Best Bait: Shrimp, worms & prawns. Bag Limit: 10. Minimum Size: 30 cm.

<u>Murray Cod:</u> Green above and pale cream below. The tail and dorsal fins are covered with many green spots. Average Size: 8 kg-35 kg. Best Bait: Small fish, do not use carp. Bag Limit: 2. Minimum Size: 60 cm.

<u>Yabbies:</u> Blue Claw: Body is usually blue-brown, native to Queensland. Egg carrying females and young must be returned to the water. Bag Limit: 100. Red Claw are not found in St George Region.

Riverbanks can become inaccessible and very boggy during and after wet weather with access being restricted for up to two weeks.

Not all fishing hot spots are designated camping locations, so pull up for the day at these spots to unwind and wait for the fish to bite. There are limited or no facilities at these locations. Drought and below average rainfall can affect water levels and impact fishing at these locations.



PLEASE NOTE: Carp (Cyprinus Carpio) can be found in our waterways. Carp must not be returned to the water alive or dead. Using carp for any reason, such as for eating or use as fertiliser, is not permitted in Queensland.



Regional Express (Rex) Airlines provide a twice-weekly air service, which will get you to St George from Brisbane, Toowoomba, Cunnamulla and Thargomindah. There are 2 flights per week on a Wednesday and Sunday. In addition, two hours' drive north in Roma there are daily Rex Airlines flights into Brisbane, with car hire facilities on offer. For bookings and/or more information call 13 17 13 or visit rex.com.au.

To fly via Qantas, Moree is two and a half hours south with direct flights from Sydney and car hire facilities, while Brisbane West Wellcamp airport near Toowoomba is four hours east with car hire facilities available.



CAR HIRE

There are currently no car hire companies operating within the Balonne Shire. The nearest available car hire is from Roma, 2 hours' drive north of St George.

Dirranbandi & Hebel

WELCOME TO DIRRANBANDI

South west of St George, Dirranbandi is a small country town that comes alive through the cotton harvest months. If you have heard of the famous Cubbie Station, then you will be interested to know that the largest irrigated cotton farm in the southern hemisphere is only a stone's throw away from this small town. As you drive into Dirranbandi, you'll pass by the town's levee bank which has famously saved the town from flooding on a number of occasions.

There's more to Dirranbandi than just cotton though, and this close-knit community is home to several very active sporting and community organizations like the Dirranbandi Show Society which does much more than just organize the local agricultural show, and the Dirranbandi Frogs, the Queensland Rugby League's 2021 Club of the Year – just to name a few.

- Although small, Dirranbandi has a busy little main street including, a few nice spots to grab a good country meal. If you're looking for a quiet spot to picnic, throw in a line, or stretch your legs, then head to the Jack Dwyer Memorial Park on the edge of town or the historic River and Rail precinct.
- This proud little town is serviced by the Dirranbandi Multipurpose Health Service, which includes a hospital, GP practice, Home and Community Care facility and hosts a range of visiting specialists and allied health professionals. Your children's education needs are covered by the fully equipped Dirranbandi P-10 State School, as well as a kindergarten and childcare centre.

MAKE HEBEL YOUR PLACE

It feels like time stands still in the little town of Hebel, were tales of the Ned Kelly Gang, Cobb & Co Coaches, and dance halls still swirl in the air. Hebel's history is told by the public art piece, the Hebel Historical Circle where, out of the red earth, tall timber posts hover over illustrated signs; each telling their own story of Hebel's history. Complete with play equipment, there is something to keep everyone occupied.

- The town was first known as Kelly's Point. Dan Kelly and Steve Hart, members of the infamous Ned Kelly gang are said to have lived here in secret.
- Hebel Hotel is a gem of a country pub. Colourful artwork by Lightning Ridge's famous artist, John Murray adorns the pub's exterior while inside its decked out with recycled furniture made from reclaimed bush finds. It's the kind of quirky place you'll want to linger to get to know the locals over a cold drink.
- Hebel General Store and Caravan Park has kept much of its original 1890s dancehall character and offers amazing home cooked cakes, desserts, and meals, as well as supplies, and even doubles as the local post office.

Signaling your approach into Thallon, are the giant grain silos, featuring the spectacular 'Watering Hole' mural painted in July 2017. Thallon is surrounded by prime grain growing country and draws grain in from Weengallon, Nindigully, Mungindi, Dirranbandi, and Thallon. The Thallon district is also known for its beef, sheep, and lamb production.

- Thallon's Francis Hotel is ready and waiting to satisfy your appetite for food and local history. Serving homemade delights and barista made espresso coffee, let your taste buds dance amongst the artefacts and photos of the pub. It also acts as the town store, information centre and post office.
- As well as being full of Murray Cod and Yellow Belly fish, the picturesque Moonie River attracts many species of birds, providing a real treat for keen birdwatchers. The area is also home to a population of the critically endangered Northern Hairy Nosed Wombats, which you can learn more about by visiting the statue known as William the Wombat.
- When you're not busy fishing, or relaxing in the Thallon Town Park, you can turn your hand to cricket and join the Thallon-Daymar Drop Bears for a game from October to March at the Thallon Recreation Grounds

WELCOME TO MUNGINDI

The unique town of Mungindi straddles the Queensland-New South Wales border and the Barwon River – it has two police stations on either side of the border, and this quirky town runs on two time zones in the warmer months due to eastern daylight saving time!

- Things might be a little different in Mungindi, due to its unique location but its still a great place to put down roots in a rich agricultural district that produces cotton, wheat, cereal crops, wool, sheep and beef cattle. MAKE BOLLON YOUR PLACE


The soil gets redder as you approach this great little western town. Bollon lies in the heart of sheep country, on the banks of the Wallam Creek - a great spot to fish or jump in for a dip on a hot summer's day. Bollon has a long and proud association with the sheep, and wool industry which are key to the local economy still today

- The centre of Bollon has a Post Office, mechanic, service station, and State School. Deb's Café serves yummy food and sells groceries, or you can enjoy a cold drink and pub meal at the Bollon Hotel.
- Like all towns in the Shire, Bollon is very much in touch with its heritage. At the Nullwaokka First Nations Gallery you can learn about it's ancient history, dream time stories and bush tucker of the Gwamu/Kooma people. Meanwhile, the Bollon Heritage Centre contains tales of the towns pastoral history and days gone by. The town's war heroes like Distinguished Flying Cross (DFC) recipient Flight Lieutenant George John (aka Jock) Steel are commemorated at the Bollon Returned Servicemen Memorial Wall in Walter Austin Memorial Park.

WELCOME TO NINDIGULLY

Just 45 km south-east of St George, 'The Gully' as it's locally known, is pretty much four houses and a pub on a riverbank. But what a pub, what a view and what characters you'll find! You'll have no trouble unwinding on the verandah of the pub as it hums with the chatter of travelers, and locals alike, enjoying happy hour and live acoustic music.

■ Perched on the banks of the Moonie River, having been established in 1864, the rustic Nindigully Pub is the longest continually licensed pub in Queensland. Have you seen the film 'Paperback Hero'? It was filmed here, and the café's boomerangs remain, in pride of place

History of the Balonne Shire

ST GEORGE

What's in a name? St George gets its name from when explorer Major Sir Thomas Mitchell crossed the Balonne River on Saint George's Day, 23 April 1846.

The Jack Taylor Weir and Andrew Nixon Bridge were constructed from 1948-52 and Beardmore Dam followed twenty years later from 1968-72. The dam's construction increased St George's Irrigation Area Supply tenfold in 1972, giving rise to the thriving cotton industry that continues to drive the town's economy today. The town's first cotton gin opened in 1976, 20km south of St George, and while that gin has been decommissioned, the Queensland Cotton Gin remains a major employer.

DIRRANBANDI

On the 4th of August 1885 the town site was proclaimed with the name Dirranbandi being believed to have come from an Aboriginal world meaning 'frogs croaking in a swamp at night'. On 22 November 2022, the Yuwaalaraay Euahlayi People's unbroken connection to the land around Dirranbandi was recognised when their Native Title Consent Determination was handed down during a High Court hearing.

In May 1913 the South Western railway was officially opened in Dirranbandi. It serviced the 413km mail run from Warwick and saw Australia's last mail train in 1993. The railway line has since been decommissioned but forms the centrepiece of the town's River and Rail Precinct.

In 2011, Dirranbandi became its own inland island, with the town becoming surrounded by flood waters during the Queensland Floods. This small town with a big heart, has made headlines in recent years thanks to the Paul Kelly and Friends Concert which began in 2018. It draws major recording artists, and fans from across the country to raise money that supports local students to pursue studies in agriculture.

HEBEL

Before being known as Hebel, the town was first know as Kelly's point and rumoured to be a secret hideout for Dan Kelly, and Steve Hart, members of the infamous Kelly Gang.

The town's name was changed to Hebel in the 1880's, although its origins remain a mystery, some suggest it was named after German settler Weiner Von Hebel or perhaps after an Aboriginal word meaning 'hot place'.

The Hebel Hotel opened in 1894 as a Cobb & Co changing station before later operating as a hotel. The hotel's original name was the Commercial Hotel. It has been revived in recent years by an enterprising local family, who have breathed new life into this classic Australian pub.

THALLON

The town's name comes from its railway station named after the Commissioner for Railways - JF Thallon, who developed most of Queensland's rail system when the railway line was extended west from Talwood.

Thallon was gazetted in 1911 as a town reserve and with the coming of the railway, shops, and a hotel were soon established. Thallon's first permanent grain storage facility was built in 1969. In 1977 two giant concrete silos were constructed, followed by another two in 1982 that now form the canvas for the town's outstanding murals.

MUNGINDI

The past is not far away in Mungindi where you can reach back through the years and touch the One Ton Post - one of the two original survey pegs dating back over 100 years. Found on the west bank of the Barwon River, the One Ton Post stands out as a remarkable monument erected by surveyor JB Cameron, to mark the end of the threeyear task surveying the straight section of the Queensland/New South Wales border, from Cameron Corner to the Barwon River.

BOLLON

It is believed the town's name originated from the Indigenous word 'Bolion' meaning 'stone tomahawk or axe' and was later adapted to the word Bollon.

Bollon's seen its fair share of major flooding events. Ask a local about the time in 2010 when the entire town was inundated except for the pub which remained the driest point in the main street! Fortunately, the town has been free from flooding since 2012 and additionally the town is now protected by a levee bank, constructed in 2015.

NINDIGULLY

The name Nindigully is said to be a combination of an Indigenous word 'nindi' meaning small, and the English word 'gully'. In the town's heyday, its main and adjoining streets boasted a hall, school, post office, telephone exchange, mechanics, store, and the pub which served as a Cobb & Co changeover station between the late 19th century and early 20th century.

In the Nindigully Pub's 150+ year history, it has seen almost as many name changes as it has poured beers. Its first name was the Nidigually Hotel, now spelt Nindigully, but it's also been known as The Grand Hotel, Travellers Rest Hotel, Sportsmans Arms Hotel and Sternes Hotel.
